MINUTE M3/2011: ADDENDUM TO REPORT NO.362- CORRECTION TO THE NAME OF THE MANUFACTURER TO BE EXCLUDED FROM THE ANTI-DUMPING DUTIES ON HEXAGON BOLTS ORIGINATING IN OR IMPORTED FROM THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

In Report No.362, the Commission recommended that anti-dumping duties be imposed on bolts of iron or steel with hexagon heads (excluding bolts of stainless steel, bolts fitted with base metal expansion sleeves, bolts identifiable for use solely or principally on aircraft and bolts manufactured by Ningbo Jinding Piece Company Limited), of a width of 6mm or more but not exceeding 36mm and a length of 10mm or more but not exceeding 400mm, whether or not with their nuts and washers originating in or imported from the People's Republic of China (PRC).

The Commission's recommendations as contained in Report 362 were approved on 17 March 2011 and implemented by the South African Revenue Service (SARS) on 6 May 2011.

However, in Report No.362, the name of the manufacturer to be excluded from the anti-dumping duties was incorrectly stated as Ningbo Jinding Piece Company Limited instead of Ningbo Jinding Fastening Piece Company Limited, with the result that products imported from this firm are now unintentionally liable for payment of the anti-dumping duties.

RECOMMENDATION

It is therefore recommended that the Minister approve the amendment to the Commission's report No.362 contained in its Minute M3/2011 that the manufacturer to be excluded from the anti-dumping duties on hexagon bolts originating in or imported from the PRC should be Ningbo Jinding Fastening Piece Company Limited. It is further recommended that the Minister approve the recommendation with retrospective effect from 6 May 2011.
